Accessing RemoteApp via "Work Resources" (Windows 7, 8, 10)

Use these instructions with any your krannert-assigned, or personally-owned windows 7, 8 or 10 computer

1) Go to Control Panel

Win 7: Click Start button -> Control Panel Win8,Win10 -> Right-click Start button, select Control Panel

2) In the upper right corner, change "View by:" to "Large icons"

- 3) Click "RemoteApp and Desktop Connections"
- 4) Win 7: Click "Set up a new connection..." Win 8/10: Click "Access RemoteApp and desktops"
- 5) In the "Connection URL" box, type:

https://virtual.krannert.purdue.edu/RDWeb/Feed/webfeed.aspx

and click Next, and Next again

Once complete, all of the RemoteApps you have access to will be added to your Programs list, grouped under a new category called "Work Resources". The image to the right shows how it looks in Windows 10. The icons can be pinned to your Task Bar, or Start Menu.

Once integrated, you no longer need to enter your logon credentials until the next time you change your password.

7) SAVING FILES: This can be confusing.

To save a file to the computer you are using, Select a location in the format: "C on COMPUTERNAME"

To save a file to your U:, V: or W: drive, Select a location in the format: "user (<u>\krannert\dfs\user</u>) U:" Technically, you can use "U on COMPUTERNAME", but this is a very slow way to save large files.

<u>NEVER save to the "Local Disk (C:)".</u> <u>This is the server, and not your local computer.</u>

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You can save to "Documents". These files will go to a subfolder of your U: drive called "RemoteApp". Do not delete the "RemoteApp" folder, it contains profile information for all of your RemoteApps.





- 8) When finished, simply close the application as you would any other. IMPORTANT NOTES:
 - Idle RemoteApps will timeout after 30 minutes of inactivity. If you reconnect within 30 minutes from the time of disconnection, you can continue where you left off.
 - If there is a temporary network disconnection between your computer and the server, again, you can reconnect within 30 minutes to continue where you left off.
 - There is a maximum session limit of 8 hours.
